




Growing Oil Insecurity in Asia-Pacific

- Asia Pacific are large oil consuming countries;
 consumption level is 400% of its production level (2016)
- Large oil import dependence creates oil vulnerability → oil insecurity
- Oil security in Asia-Pacific is complex challenge because the region is diverse in scales and national interests
- Each country has its own approach in coping with oil insecurity



Oil Security Measures

- Develop alternative fuels to oil (biofuel, gas, EV)
- Improve oil use efficiency
- Diversify oil import sources
- Improve emergency preparedness
 - Restraining of oil consumption (mandatory)
 - Fuel switching
 - Prevent hoarding and panic purchase (accurate oil market information)
- Develop emergency oil stockpile
- Establish cooperation (consumer-consumer, consumer producer)

Oil Stockpile System

Owner: Government vs. Private Stockpile

Type: Crude Oil vs. Petroleum Products

Location: In country vs. in oil producing countries

Scheme: Joint vs. Individual Stockpile

Oil Stockpile

- Several major oil importing countries has developed or is developing their own strategic oil stockpiles.
- Some studies show that regional coordination in stockpiling arrangements and sharing of oil stocks in an emergency could provide significant benefits.
- As of now there is no regionalized oil security system in Asia-Pacific
- There are initiatives for the development of joint oil stockpile in the region:
 - APEC-EWG
 - -ASEAN + 3
 - Asia Cooperation Dialogue (ACD)
 - Roundtable of Asian and Middle East Ministers on Oil and Gas Coop.
 - APSA (ASEAN Petroleum Security Agreement)
