




Effects of Disasters to Consumers



MAGNA CARTA OF WOMEN

on Women

SEC. 10. Women Affected by Disasters, Calamities, and Oth Crisis Situations. - Women have the right to protection and security times of disasters, calamities, and other crisis situations especially in a phases of relief, recovery, rehabilitation, and construction efforts. Case Study

According to DSWD, an estimated 233,697 pregnant women have been affected and critically require specialised reproductive health services. In evacuation centres alone where the displaced are temporarily housed, the count of pregnant women stood at 7,973 during TyphoonYolanda.
