

FIRE SAFETY TIPS

By virtue of Proclamation Nos. 360, s. 1989 and 115-A s. 1966, March has been declared as Fire Prevention Month as this is one of the hottest months of the year when, historically, occurrence of fire incidents is high.

To keep our family safe at home, here are some fire safety tips:

- Check all appliance and lighting for frayed or damaged cords. Unplug and replace them immediately.
- Never leave your cooking unattended.
- Avoid octopus wiring connections.
- Don't overload outlets with high-wattage devices.
- Be sure to unplug all electrical appliances before leaving your homes for summer outings or long vacation.

- If you encounter regular problems with an outlet or wiring such as sparking, frequent blown fuse, and/or constant flickering of lights, contact a licensed electrician to immediately address these.
- Keep matches and lighters out of reach of children.
- Keep burning candles at least a foot away from combustible materials.
- Never leave a burning candle unattended, even for a minute.
- Use extension cords only as temporary devices. If you intend to you them full time, install a new outlet.
- If possible, install smoke detectors/alarms in risk areas such as kitchen and garage.
- Have escape ladders and fire extinguishers on hand for emergencies.



- Don't place electrical wires or extension cords under rugs, carpets, furniture, etc. Cords may get warm and if they fray or get damaged, these may pose fire hazards.
- Don't store flammables such as gasoline, cleaning agents, paints, adhesives, etc. near a heating source. At high temperatures, vapors can ignite. Store them in a cool, ventilated area.
- Do not smoke while grilling.
- Don't overload your drier as this may result to an excess of lint, which is a Firestarter.
- Keep all valuables and important documents in a fireproof safe.
- Talk to family members about fire hazards and prepare an escape plan.
